### Catholic Life of the school

#### Year 2 and Year 6 Statutory Assessment Tests

During the month of May, Year 2 will be taking part in the Key Stage 1 Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs) these include completing two reading papers, a grammar and spelling paper and two mathematical papers (known as quizzes to the children). Miss Davidson and Miss Cruickshank have been busy preparing them for these tests. Results, should be available to parents before the end of the academic year.

Year 6 will be completing the SATs w/c 9<sup>th</sup> May 2022. Again, Miss Brown and Mrs Oakes have been busy preparing them for the tests. The tests take place on the following days:

#### Attendance 2021 -2022

Having the best attendance at school is vitally important, as this leads to improved learning for your child (knowing more, remembering more and doing more). Our attendance/family support worker Jan, has produced a 'Good Attendance Guide' which you will receive with this newsletter. Please take the time to read through it.

If your child's attendance has dropped below 90% you will shortly be receiving a letter from school.

As you are aware, holidays during term time **cannot be authorised**. The table below shows the impact that time out has on learning. Please note, the Local Authority may issue a Penalty notice to each parent of each child who is withdrawn from school during term time.

100% Attendance	0 weeks of missed learning	Best chance of success. Fantastic!
95% Attendance	1 week, 4 days of missed learning	Chance of success. Well Done!
90% Attendance	3 weeks, 4 days of missed learning	Persistent Absentee. Worrying- At risk of legal action from the Local Authority.
85% Attendance	5 weeks, 3 days of missed learning	Poor Attendance. Very worrying.
80% Attendance	7 weeks, 3 days of missed learning	Very Poor Attendance Very concerning.

If you feel there is an exceptional circumstance where your child needs to have a leave of absence from school, then please complete the 'Exceptional Circumstances form' and return to school at least 14 days in advance of any request for absence. The form can be obtained from the school office and from the school website under parent information attendance/absence. An appointment with a member of the Senior Leadership Team will be arranged to discuss your request.

Please see below details of attendance recorded in school from the start of the autumn term. Pupil attendance at school has been mandatory since September and the usual rules on attendance apply, including:

- Parents' duty to ensure that all children attend at all times
- Schools' responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence
- The ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, in line with local authorities' codes of conduct.

Please remember to contact school before 9:30 a.m. if your child will be absent from school.

### Uniform for 2021-22

At St Cuthbert's, we aim for high standards in all aspects of school life, which includes uniform. Our uniform is smart and hardwearing. It also gives a sense of belonging to our school family and promotes a sense of pride in our school. I ask that all parents support our commitment to excellence and inclusion by making sure your child wears the correct school uniform, including black school shoes. We ask children to wear their polo t-shirt tucked into their skirts or trousers and to take a pride in their personal appearance. Thank you for taking part in the consultation on school uniform, all information is being collated and will be presented to our Local Governing Committee at our next meeting.

## Safety and school policy reminders

For safety reasons children are <u>not</u> permitted to wear earrings in school. All earrings must be removed prior to coming into school.

Extreme hairstyles, dyed hair, hair gel, holiday braids etc. are not permitted. Long hair must be tied back for safety and hygiene reasons.

# Every child needs to bring their school book bag containing their reading book to school each day. Back packs are not permitted.
