#### Attendance 2021 -2022

We are trying to ensure that children have the best attendance at school, as this leads to improved learning (knowing more, remembering more and doing more). We understand that sometimes this isn't possible; if your child is ill and to unwell to come to school or has to follow guidelines with regards to COVID or other illnesses that can be easily spread in school.

As you are aware, holidays during term time **cannot be authorised**. The table below shows the impact that time out has on learning. Please note, the Local Authority may issue a Penalty notice to each parent of each child who is withdrawn from school during term time.

100% Attendance	0 weeks of missed learning	Best chance of success. Fantastic!
95% Attendance	1 week, 4 days of missed learning	Chance of success. Well Done!
90% Attendance	3 weeks, 4 days of missed learning	Persistent Absentee. Worrying- At risk of legal action from the Local Authority.
85% Attendance	5 weeks, 3 days of missed learning	Poor Attendance. Very worrying.
80% Attendance	7 weeks, 3 days of missed learning	Very Poor Attendance Very concerning.

If you feel there is an exceptional circumstance where your child needs to have a leave of absence from school, then please complete the 'Exceptional Circumstances form' and return to school at least 14 days in advance of any request for absence. The form can be obtained from the school office and from the school website under parent information attendance/absence. An appointment with a member of the Senior Leadership Team will be arranged to discuss your request.

Please see below details of attendance recorded in school from the start of the autumn term. Pupil attendance at school has been mandatory since September and the usual rules on attendance apply, including:

- Parents' duty to ensure that all children attend at all times
- Schools' responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence

• The ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, in line with local authorities' codes of conduct

## Uniform for 2021-22

At St Cuthbert's, we aim for high standards in all aspects of school life, which includes uniform. Our uniform is smart and hardwearing. It also gives a sense of belonging to our school family and promotes a sense of pride in our school. I ask that all parents support our commitment to excellence and inclusion by making sure your child wears the correct school uniform, including black school shoes. We ask children to wear their polo t-shirt tucked into their skirts or trousers and to take a pride in their personal appearance. Thank you for taking part in the consultation on school uniform, all information is being collated and will be presented to our Local Governing Committee at our next meeting.

## Safety and school policy reminders

For safety reasons children are <u>not</u> permitted to wear earrings in school. All earrings must be removed prior to coming into school.

Extreme hairstyles, dyed hair, hair gel, holiday braids etc. are not permitted. Long hair must be tied back for safety and hygiene reasons.

# Every child needs to bring their school book bag containing their reading book to school each day. Back packs are not permitted.

### Parking

Thank you to all our parents and carers who have helped us to keep the traffic moving safely in the morning, by parking away from school or using the quick drop off in the turning circle.

As part of the travel tracker, every day children record how they have travelled to school and will receive a badge at the end of the month for having at least three active trips per week.
