

On Monday, we will give the children more information on what we want them to do.

Learn to read, read to learn

You should have received a password for your child to access the online library at Oxford Reading elibrary ; your child's teacher will give advice on the books to read for next week and from then on at weekends.

Please return any school reading books you have at home from w/c 8th March so that we can quarantine them for use by another child. Reading books for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be issued on a Monday and collected back in on a Friday. An Oxford Reading Tree eLibrary book will be recommended for the weekend. Children in Years 3-6 will be encouraged to read the online books next week and will be issued with a reading book from w/c 15th March. As their books take longer to read they will not always need to be changed on a Monday. The children will also be recommended an online book to read.

Asymptomatic testing information for parents and adults in households with children at school or college

NHS Test and Trace announced earlier this week, that all adults in households with school and college age children without symptoms can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing.

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus.

Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are [different ways](#) for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site – anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online – please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test.

Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.

School re-opening

You will already have received the letter, detailing the re-opening of school on Monday 8th March, please follow the information provided on pick up and drop off times. We are very much looking

forward to welcoming them all back. Remember, attendance at school is compulsory.

Finally, on behalf of everyone at St Cuthbert's, thank you for the work you have completed in supporting your child's home learning. We know that this has not always been easy for you. Have a great weekend, relax and we will take it from here.
